# Stop Press! Resolution selection results announcement!

The 2024/25 Resolution selection results are in! Between November and February, every WI member had the chance to have their say on the shortlist and the resolution they would like to see go forward to the Annual Meeting in June. The results of the 2025 resolution shortlist selection are:

#### The NFWI Board of Trustees has agreed to put forward the top resolution 'Bystanders Can be Lifesavers' to the Annual Meeting in June.

The wording of the resolution is as follows:

There are over 30,000 out of hospital cardiac arrests a year in the UK and less than one in ten people survive. Women have a lower chance of surviving than men. Early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and defibrillating can more than double the chances of survival. We call on WI members to work together to increase public confidence and training in the delivery of CPR and to work with local organisations to help to improve access to defibrillators in their communities to give every person the best chance of surviving a cardiac arrest.



#### Next steps - voting

WIs should now consider how they wish their delegate to vote on the resolution at the NFWI Annual Meeting on 4 June 2025. All WIs get one vote on the resolution – for or against.

WIs may choose to give their link delegate discretion to decide how to vote after hearing the speakers and the debate at the Annual Meeting. Please ensure your WI makes it clear to your link delegate whether you are granting her discretion.

Federation Representatives and WI link delegates will cast their votes electronically via Electionbuddy during the relevant voting sessions. Further details and how to access the voting links will be shared in the lead up to the event. No votes may be cast before or after the meeting.



WIs and federations are also encouraged to hold discussion events to allow members to consider

how they wish their delegate to vote. The NFWI will also be hosting a discussion event. Please see below for further details.

Spend a day exploring 300 years of History at Blenheim Palace – the home of the Dukes of Marlborough and the birthplace of Sir Winston Churchill. Blenheim Palace is an UNESCO World Heritage Site, boasting a long and diverse history. The visit will give you access to the grounds, gardens and the Palace.



You can do a self-guided tour or join a guided tour which start at 12.00 and 2.00pm, meeting in the Great Hall. If members prefer to do a self-guided tour they can, if they wish, download an app for an Audio Tour. If you decide to do this, please remember to bring your headphones!

There are a range of cafés and restaurants on the site, a shop and of course there is the Churchill Exhibition and much more for members to explore during the day.

# **AFWI Federation Holiday April 2025**

#### THE HISTORY & HERITAGE OF MALTA Departing 10 October 2025 for six days from £1,549, staying at the Victoria Hotel in Sliema

On day 5 of the holiday, we'll visit the Church of St Mary in Mosta. Built in 1860, the church is renowned for its dome which is the third largest in Europe. We will then continue to Mdina, the ancient capital city of Malta, locally known as the 'Silent City'. Our guided tour takes in the defence bastions dating back to the 9th century and St Peter and St Paul's Cathedral. Finally, we visit the Palazzo Falson Historic House Museum, the former home of Captain Olof Frederick Gollcher, the son of a prosperous shipping merchant of Swedish descent. Gollcher was an artist, scholar and philanthropist, but also a discerning collector of objets d'art and historical objects. Palazzo Falson was not only his home, but also a setting



for his works of art and antiques. A farewell dinner is included in our hotel this evening.
